

Pearl of the Black sea



Yalta - the famous pearl by the Black Sea. Everyone who comes here one-way or another comes to the seafront. The promenade is beautiful, however, there are some hidden gems within it and not everybody knows about them. Luckily, you can always ask your concierge, as a local he knows everything and will give you the best advice.

I suggest leaving the embankment behind and turning to one of the smaller streets that lead to the heart of the town, where you will find some amazing examples of architecture that dates back to 19th century.

One of such buildings is a former profitable house of Shiryaev P.A. built in 1907 by the city's main architect - Nikolai Krasnov. You will recognize it by a woman's face sculpture on the façade.



Continue your way through the Chekhov street and take a coffee break at one of the best coffee shops – “Coffeedvig”.

Not far from it you will find sanatorium “Kyiv”, which no longer exists, but the carved wooden exterior of it is unique. Make a turn to Ekaterininskaya Street and come back to the seafront passing the museum of the famous writer -

Lesya Ukrainka, the style of which was done in the same manner as the sanatorium.



If you're looking for some peace, rent a car and drive to the Cat mountain not far from the city. You don't need to be a pro at hiking, just wear some comfortable shoes. Take a walk along the evergreen “spine” of the Cat and admire stunning views of the sea and two villages - Simeiz and Katsiveli. The best time would be at sunset.

Those who is looking for some extreme, can



come down to the heart of Simeiz village and climb the steps of Diva rock or walk along the skybridge above the breaking waves, which operate during summer.

The best way to see places outside of the city - is to rent a car. There are numerous car rentals on the peninsula, but I will do my best to find the best deals for you, based on your preferences or offer you one of the hotel`s car.
